OVER 1300 TONS OF STORM DEBRIS PICKED UP AND DEBRIS PICKUP CONTINUES!

276.33 tons of debris was collected today! Over **1,300 tons** of storm debris total has been collected since Friday. We anticipate that by the end of this week we will have completed the first round of debris collection.

Beginning tomorrow and the rest of the week, crews will be picking up in **Copperfield, Woodcrest, Southlake, Romero Street, & Detente**. If there are other areas that we have not visited please contact City Hall at 856-4181 or by emailing info@youngsvillela.gov. Please keep the streets in these areas as clear as possible so that crews can have access. Debris cannot be picked up if vehicles are blocking the property.



For your safety please have patience with our crews and Youngsville Police as they block access to streets. Visibility is limited with equipment and heavy trucks. As a reminder, if debris needs to be picked up, please do not put in trailers or next to mailboxes, cable or electric boxes.

Reminder: If you have debris on private property outside of the city right away, a hold harmless agreement must be signed. It can be done online [here](#) or in person at City Hall before debris can be removed. Thank you for your assistance as we continue to clean up and restore our city!
