FEMA ASSISTANCE - WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW

Disaster Survivor Assistance Team (DSAT) with FEMA will be going door to door in the affected areas. These FEMA representatives will be wearing an ID in a lanyard or on their shirts. These associates are available to register you for FEMA assistance and can also update your information if you have already registered. These agents are the "safety nets" to make sure no one is left out. Within 7-10 days of registering you will be contacted by a FEMA inspector. This representative will also have a FEMA ID. This is when your property will be inspected. In most cases you will receive a notification by email or mail within several days which will contain your claim approval or denial.

It is very important to register with FEMA. If for any reason, your claim approval is denied, you will then be added as an applicant for SBA assistance.

Our Administration met with FEMA, as well as local and parish officials on Tuesday, August 23, 2016 to address questions on recovery efforts, such as individual assistance and debris pickup. [See the important meeting information here.](#)

OVER 1360 TONS OF STORM DEBRIS PICKED UP AND DEBRIS PICKUP CONTINUES!

61.36 tons of debris was collected today! Over **1,360 tons** of storm debris total has been collected since Friday. We anticipate that by the end of this week we will have completed the first round of debris collection.

Through the rest of the week, crews will continue picking up throughout the city in areas that have still not received an initial pass for debris. If your home has not been visited yet, please contact City Hall at 856-4181 or by emailing info@youngsvillela.gov. Please keep the streets in these areas as clear as possible so that crews can have access. Debris cannot be picked up if vehicles are blocking the property.

For your safety please have patience with our crews and Youngsville Police as they block access to streets. Visibility is limited with equipment and heavy trucks. As a reminder, if debris needs to be picked up, please do not put in trailers or next to mailboxes, cable or electric boxes.

Reminder: If you have debris on private property outside of the city right away, a hold harmless agreement must be signed. It can be done online [here](#) or in person at City Hall before debris can be removed. Thank you for your assistance as we continue to clean up and restore our city!
