GOVERNOR JOHN BEL EDWARDS VISITS THE CITY OF YOUNGSVILLE



Earlier today, Governor John Bel Edwards toured several areas in the city of Youngsville that had been devastated by the recent flooding. The Governor spoke with several flood victims to address their concerns while touring damaged homes. The Governor's visit was initially scheduled for 45 minutes, but Governor Edwards spent nearly two hours in the city assessing damage and the recovery effort, meeting with city leaders, and visiting with flood victims.

Mayor Ken Ritter stated, "We are very grateful that the Governor chose to visit Youngsville to meet with our residents and check in on our recovery. We are working very closely with government at all levels to provide information regarding rebuilding and recovery. The Governor and his office have been very responsive and I am thankful for his leadership in this time of need." Mayor Ritter also took the opportunity to provide Governor Edwards with an analysis of critical infrastructure repairs that will be required as a result of the recent storm event.

- **Wednesday, August 31: L-R**
- **Thursday, September 1: S-Z**
- **Friday, September 2: A-K applicants unable to make prior scheduled day**
- **Saturday, September 3: L-Z applicants unable to make prior scheduled day**

ALMOST 1500 TONS OF STORM DEBRIS PICKED UP!

Yesterday, 40 tons of debris was collected and today another 33 tons of debris was collected! A total of **1,490 tons** of storm debris total has been collected since last Friday. The city's contractor is very close to completing the first round of storm debris pick up and will resume work on Friday. If you are in an area of our city that has not had storm debris picked up, please call **City Hall at (337) 856-4181**. Our contractor will assess locations throughout the weekend and will resume storm debris pick-up on Monday. This will enable any flood affected resident the opportunity to continue storm related clean-up this weekend.

Reminder: If you have debris on private property outside of the city right away, a hold harmless agreement must be signed. It can be done online [here](#) or in person at City Hall before debris can be removed. Thank you for your assistance as we continue to clean up and restore our city!

280 STORM RECONSTRUCTION PERMITS ISSUED

280 storm reconstruction permits were issued through today. Mayor Ritter and the City Council are waiving reconstruction permit fees for residents affected by the flooding until October 31, 2016. Apply in person at City Hall at 305 Iberia Street. Regular business hours are Monday - Friday, 7:30am - 4pm.

WATER BILL DUE DATE EXTENDED

Water bills are due August 27, but Mayor Ritter has announced that the city of Youngsville will extend the due date until **September 15**.
